How can we work together to reduce the significant inequalities that exist in Kensington + Chelsea?

Kensington and Chelsea is a borough usually associated with affluence and wealth, but it also has areas of severe deprivation and significant inequalities.

Some startling facts that you may not know about K+C:

- K+C has the worst rate of school exclusions in London and 1 in 4 children live in poverty

- K+C is in the lowest 20% of Local Authorities for mental health performance
- The unemployment rate in K+C is 50% higher than the London average and 1 in 5 workers live in poverty.

The K+C Foundation was set up in 2008 by local resident, Jeremy Raphaely, who was aware of these inequalities in our borough and was determined to gain support from like-minded people to help address them. Over the last 12 months, they have invested £1.8m in over 157 impactful local projects that improve the lives and life chances of some of the most disadvantaged and vulnerable residents in our borough. The Foundation's priorities for 2022 and beyond will focus on reducing education inequalities, increasing skills and employment and improving mental health. They would very much welcome the opportunity to talk to individuals and businesses who are interested in supporting their local community.

KCWC is always keen to showcase accomplished women doing a herculean job and so May finds us honouring Colonel Jane Davis OBE, Vice Lord-Lieutenant of London. Having qualified as a nurse in 1976 after training at St Stephen's Hospital London, Colonel Davis has specialised in A&E nursing care primarily at NHS London Hospitals. A highly decorated individual having been awarded the distinguished Order of the British Empire in the New Year's Honours in 2012, Colonel Davis had previously earned the QVRM in the Honours of 2001.

After serving as the Queen's Honourary Nurse 2005–09, the Colonel was appointed Deputy Lieutenant for Greater London in 2008 and in 2018, Vice Lord Lieutenant of Greater London, a post she continues to hold.

She was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the Territorial Army in 1981, a Colonel in Afghanistan deployed in 2011 where she served as Senior Nurse.

When Covid concerns threatened the NHS capacity, Colonel Davis was called upon to organise the Nightingale Hospitals.

Colonel Davis travels widely with The HALO Trust an International NGO that she has supported for over 27 years with specific attention to training programmes for minefield paramedics. In this capacity she has visited Angola, Mozambique, Somaliland, Kosovo, Abkhazia, Georgia, Nagorno Karabakh, Cambodia, Lebanon, Ivory Coast, Sri Lanka, The West Bank, Columbia, Zimbabwe, Myanmar and Afghanistan.

It is always a pleasure to welcome esteemed author, Anne Sebba to our podium, as a guest speaker we have previously hosted to great acclaim and enjoyment. She joins us after promoting her newest release hard copy book at the Victoria and Albert Museum. Now out in paperback, Anne will relate the story of *Ethel Rosenberg, A Cold War Tragedy*.

The story of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg – considered America's Dreyfus Affair – has captivated and divided those familiar with this notorious and tragic case. A young Jewish American couple, the Rosenbergs were the first civilians to be charged and executed for espionage in peacetime. Caught in an anti-Communist fever,

prevalent in the early 1950s, the couple, in particular young mother Ethel, have long been considered victims of a miscarriage of justice, haunting the national conscience. Anne brings an informed perspective owing to her copious research that has reignited interest in this case and the questionable charge that the Rosenbergs were guilty of passing atomic secrets to the Russians.

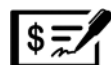

NEW MEMBERS/RENEWALS

Annual dues are £115.00 plus a one-time £15.00 administration fee for new members. You can join KCWC or renew online at www.kcwc.org.uk. Membership forms are available on our website. Fill in the application and provide payment via a debit or credit card. To join offline, or renew your membership in person, you may attend a General Meeting Speaker Series and visit the bookkeeping desk where payment can be provided by cheque though preferably a debit or credit card.

A new membership is effective for 12 months from the date that payment is processed or a member ID number is issued, whichever occurs first. Subsequent renewals are effective for 12 months from the original expiration date. Members who renew up to three months after their expiration date will be considered to be renewing retroactively

to their last expiration date. After three months the payment will be considered to be for a new membership and will incur a £15.00 administration fee. Please note that dues are non-refundable and membership is non-transferable.

Membership cards will no longer be printed as we look for a more sustainable alternative to our current format. These will likely be sent electronically, upon completion of membership renewal or application.

LOOKING WITH EYES WIDE OPEN – THE SCEPTICAL EYE

Recognising that a painting is by one artist rather than another can sometimes be like recognising the handwriting of someone you know well. It is an immediate and certain recognition, but you probably couldn't put into words what exactly is so distinctive.

It is vital for us to be able to tell the difference between something the artist himself put on his canvas, and something that was added – or removed – in the subsequent decades of the

painting's life. In this session, we will ask whether we are seeing what the artist produced, or whether time or other humans have altered it.

The final challenge is to distinguish between artist and copyist or forger. Determining the difference between copy and original is one of the most difficult areas of the art world. This is the ultimate test for the seeing eye!

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO: WHISTLER'S WOMAN IN WHITE: JOANNA HIFFERMAN, A TWO PART SERIES

This set of two lectures by Jo Rhymer explores the world of **James McNeill Whistler 1834–1903**. He was an American artist active during the American Gilded Age and based primarily in England.

In the first session, Jo will look at Whistler's images of the Thames and his connections with French avant-garde artists including Gustave Courbet, who worked closely together with Whistler in Normandy.

In the second session, Jo will focus on the exhibition at the Royal Academy "**Whistler's Woman In White; Joanna Hifferman**" which runs from 26 February – 22 May 2022.

Many of Whistler's works feature the red-haired figure of Joanna Hifferman. Her relationship with Whistler ran deeper than artist and muse. Her close professional and personal relationship with the artist lasted for two decades, yet little about her role or influence as a friend, model, lover and collaborator in his life has been explored – until now.

This exhibition brings together portraits of Hifferman, ranging from innovative paintings, prints and drawings that challenged cultural norms and established Whistler's reputation as one of the most influential artists of the late 19th century.

WUNDERKAMMERN – OPENING THE CABINET OF CURIOSITIES IN MODERN EUROPE

In this lecture, Albert Godetzky will explore the beginnings of a collecting culture in Europe as well as the motivations which came to govern the organisation of art and artefacts in the *Kunst- and Wunderkammern* of the 16th and 17th Centuries. From small, ornate tabletop cabinets crafted from rare woods and inlays, to sequences of opulent rooms in princely palaces, European collectors brought together diverse objects – often of an exotic provenance – to impress upon visitors the collector's erudition, wealth and power.

We will consider a selection of case-studies revealing the breadth of the nature of collecting, from the court of Rudolf II in Prague to the merchants of Holland during the seventeenth

century, the so-called Golden Age. Finally, we move from the historical examples to address the ways in which the *Kunst- and Wunderkammern* have shaped the nature of our modern-day museums and galleries. Albert Godetzky will tie together the various threads showing how collections changed from symbols of power, to tools of learning in today's art world.

The view of the Thames at Richmond, painted by many but most famously by JMW Turner, transformed ideas of natural beauty as the formality of the Tudors and Stuarts gave way to the rise of Romanticism.

Richmond has had a royal connection for 700 years and we'll explore the remains of the Tudor Palace where Elizabeth I died. In the 18th Century, the riverside became a centre of culture to rival the Royal Court. Great writers like Jonathan Swift and Alexander Pope provided the intellectual entertainment for the rich and famous who built great houses along the river Thames. Later, King Louis Philippe of France was in exile there from 1815 as was his grandson, Philippe, who reigned France for just two days.

From French royalty we'll move to Rock royalty and visit Eel Pie Island, the birthplace of British Rock and Blues: including Rolling Stones, The Who, Pink Floyd, Rod Stewart, and Eric Clapton.

We'll eat in a riverside pub before returning to Richmond, using a historic ferry, to explore Ham House and the Richmond bank.

Claudia was born and raised in Montréal, Canada in an Italian-Canadian family. She is fluent in Italian, French and English.

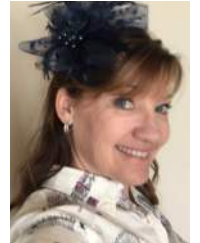
